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100 History of Gujarati Samaj, Indore

Glorious years in the service of society through Quality Education



Shri Gujarati Samaj is a huge centre dedicated to education. It is the largest complex not only of Indore but of the state. In order to maintain a live contact with their language and culture among the professionally adventurous Gujaratis who came from Gujarat, in 1923, started a small school with a strength of only 7 students on Jail Road. In view of the increase in numbers and the problem of space, the school was run from a rented house in Siyaganj by the efforts of self benefactor Nathabhai Patel and Purshottamdas Gordhandas Patel and late Manilal Baldevdas Parikh. After that, due to his efforts and charity, this small school took the form of primary and secondary school in 1925 and 1932 respectively. Professionally and financially successful Shri Manilal Parikh was of deep spiritual nature. This spirituality had made him with a big heart. By the time of 1942, to give this school a huge size, Seth Shri not only donated Rs. 35000/-, but with his own and his companions, through effort, Rs. 1,80,000/- from city to city door-to-door. In 1946 RRMB emerged as Gujarat High School and in 1948 became Higher Secondary School. The visit of Shri Vallabhbhai Patel to Indore in 1948 gave a new enthusiasm to the Gujaratis here and they got involved in the development work by adopting the vision of the benefit of all Indians. And commerce subjects were taught, night arts faculty was started in 1956 for the novel profession class. This inter college was made a degree college in 1958. Smt. C.M.P. Vidhyalaya was established in 1957 with the support of Mrs. Manilal Parikh, wife of Sethji. The society got land from the government on Maharani Road for the expansion of education, where in 1962 Shri K.B. Patel Kanya Vidhyalaya was established. In 1953, Danveer Shri Govardhandas Patel built the Shri

Ghelabhai Nathabhai Patel Bal Mandir on Maharani Road in the memory of his father. By 1970, due to the increase in the scope of the college, it was divided into the independent parts of the College of Science and the College of Arts, Commerce and Law. In 1970, Arts Faculty started the post graduate classes in Arts and in 1974 in Science College in Botany and Chemistry. Started in the year 1982. Of. H. S. Yes. CC is the first girls' commerce college in the country. It is donated by Matushree Kankuben Hirachand Sanghvi, Household Trust. In 1983 and 1986, P.G. of Home Science and Commerce respectively. Classes started. Realizing the need for employable modern education, Shri Gujarati Samaj established Women's Vocational Training Centre. Done in the year 1989. The city was first in the state in starting the Gujarati Science Mahavidyalaya, Microbiology, Electronic Computer Science, subject at the undergraduate level. Later, new courses in Biotechnology and Information Technology were also started in the college. Started a huge multipurpose education complex on 12 acres of land in plan number 54 located on AB Road. Self. The Ajmera Mukesh Nemichand English Medium School, which is recognized by the Central Board of Education, Delhi, was established in 1992 by donating by the Mukesh Ajmera Parmarthik Trust. Since then this school is earning success and popularity every year. Behind the College of Science and Commerce, a huge field of about 5 acres is named after Sardar Patel. Here the state of the institution is famous gym which is equipped with all kinds of equipment. All sports related facilities are available here. Along with traditional education, society has entered in the field of vocational and business oriented education. by society since 1999. Homeopathic Medical College and Research Center is running. Similarly, since 2001, the society has established Institute of National Studies have started. In this M.C.M. B. CA. etc. courses are being conducted and MBA has also been started. Both these colleges are located under the new campus scheme of the society. Running in 54. This complex has been fully constructed at present. It has been established as a fully furnished campus. Donor Shri Ashok Patel has donated 43 lakhs to the society in the memory of his parents for both the colleges. Both the colleges are named after their parents as Smt. Kamalaben Raojibhai Patel Gujarati Homeopathic College Hospital and Research Center and Raojibhai Gokalbhai Patel Gujarati Professional Institute respectively. Keeping in view the demand and need of the time, in the year 2005-06 Shri Gujarati Samaj B. Ed. College was established. The donor has donated Rs.21,00,000/- to the Innovative College in the memory of Shri Jayantibhai Sanghvi to Shri Deepchand Gardi Charitable Trust, Mumbai and renamed the Innovative College in his memory as "Shri Jayantilal Hirachand Sanghvi Gujarati Innovative College of Commerce and Science". Another new college has been started in the society from the year 2007-08 in the name of "Shri Gujarati Samaj College of Pharmacy" and for the name of this college "Nutanben Mansukhbhai Turkhia (Public Trust) Mumbai" Rs.22 A donation of 61,000/- has been received. The Pharmacy College has been named "Mrs. Nutanaben Mansukhbhai Turkhia Gujarati College of Pharmacy" after the donor About 9 bighas of land has been purchased by the society on Dhar road and 41,000 sq. feet on Rajendra Nagar and in future construction work will be done at both these places as per requirement. This was also a great achievement for the society. In the Minorities Commission, all the schools and colleges run by Shri Gujarati Samaj have been granted a certificate of linguistic minority, considering them as educational institutions run by the linguistic minority community. There is no house in Indore city, whose members have not taken education in Gujarati society. Every seventh student of the university is from Gujarati College. Presently the society is running the college and 6 schools. Around 21,967 students are studying here. About 1,252 teachers and staff are offering their sacrifices in this education. Country in Shri Gujarati Samaj Leader, Minister, IAS I.P.S. Officers have been given successful industrialists, scientists and scholars. School run by Shri Gujarati Samaj, Indore. R. M. B. Gujarati U.M. School, Shri K. B. Patel Gujarati Girl U.M. The full fees of Gujarati students studying in Vidhyalaya and Mrs. Champ Gujarati Primary and Secondary School are waived off and school uniforms, copy-books, school bags and school shoes are also given free of cost to the Gujarati students. Shri Gujarati Samaj, Indore run by A. M. N. 50% concession in fees of Gujarati students studying in English Medium School (relaxation is given). In the colleges run by Shri Gujarati Samaj Indore (except Homeopathic Professional B.Ed. and Pharmacy), a concession of 50% is given in the fees of Gujarati students. Financial assistance is provided by the society to Gujarati students for their education. According to the rules, the fees of poor students (non-Gujarati) in all (school/college) are also deducted by the society. There are total 87 buses, 10 small vehicles (2 Bolero, 6 storm and 2 Nissan car) and 1 pick-up vehicle in the society for the transportation facility of the students, which is according to the rules of the government. PS The cameras are being operated with the facilities of seat belt, speed governor. Apart from the education sector, Shri Gujarati Samaj is also a leader in social service. Many activities conducted by the society for the purpose of service are happening. Some of the main activities are as follows:

- * In 1963, for the convenience of outside passengers, R. R. Contractor guest house was constructed. In view of the increasing number of passengers, the society has constructed a new guest house and in view of the increasing number of Gujarati members, the Wadi has been constructed in Snehlataganj on a plot of 8400 square feet, the new guest house is very modern and AC. Has room facilities. In which 20 A. There is also a C room, 2 common halls, lift facility. The new guest house also has facilities for conducting Manglik and Matrimonial functions. In addition, a solar panel plant has also been installed in the guest house, which will save a lot of electricity.
- In the basement of guest house located at Snehlataganj and the scheme of the society, 54 families and health centre at Navlakha are being operated successfully, in which many state-of-the-art machines have been installed. The annual fee of the health centre should be minimum Rs. 120/- per person per annum has been kept and many Gujarati families (Elder, Female and Male) are in this gymnasium are getting benefited.
- * Shri Gujarati Samaj, Indore by Scheme no. 54 campus A 100-bed grand hospital is being built in the 54-located campus, in which facilities of state-of-the-art testing machines, CT scan, Ventilator, ECG, oxygen machine, beds, etc. will be provided and medical staff will also be appointed.
- * Various programs are organized from time to time to familiarize yourself with the Gujarati language and culture. Under this, programs of Natak, Diara and Geet-sangeet, Garba etc. are organized in the language, in which Gujarati artists perform their art.
- * Deepawali Milan ceremony is also organized by the society, in which the seniors of the entire Gujarati Peta society are honored with shawl-shripal and melodious songs and music are also organized for Gujarati families.
- * A three-day grand scale 'Swad Vangi' is also organized by the society, in which different types of Gujarati Food stalls are set up. Along with this, melodious song music is also organized for the citizens of the city and Various types of swings are also installed for the children.
- * Free medical camps are organized by the society from time to time at different places for the members of the society. In which many Gujarati family members take advantage of it. In the medical aid for the members by the society, the member who levies the original bill of the hospital with the form and who does not have a med claim, an amount of up to 25% is given as assistance according to the expenses and the members who have med claim OR Duplicate bill is attached with the form, according to the cost, an amount of up to 15% is given to them as assistance
- * 8 outpatient centres are running in the city under the homeopathic college, where treatment is done at minimum fee. She goes. Is A total of 61,445 patients were treated last year. Simultaneously, the construction work of the new hospital building has also been started.
- * Premises at Nasia Road and Scheme No. A new Badminton Court has been constructed in the 54th campus, in which students and Gujarati brothers and sisters are taking advantage of it. R. R. M. B. The Central Hall situated at the centre has been renovated, which has been replaced by A.C. Sound system equipped with state-of-the-art lighting has been done.
- * A new basketball court has been constructed in the premises of Sardar Patel Ground and Scheme No. 54 and stairs have been built all around the ground. Keeping in view the cleanliness, compost machine has also been installed in the premises located at Scheme 54 of the society.
- * Gandhi statue was installed in all the three premises by the society.
- * P.M. located at Sardar Patel Maidan by the society. On top of the roof of the Gujarati Science College, the self. Mukeshbhai Kantibhai Patel Auditorium Hall was constructed.
- * To make Gujarati women self-reliant, free sewing training is given by Shri Gujarati Samaj and trainees Free sewing machines are given to women. So far, sewing machines have been distributed to 1,513 women.
- * In the medical facility being provided by the society to Gujarati brothers/sisters. Also the elderly people of the society whose age Those above 65 years of age Rs.500/- per month and above the age of 75 years Rs.600/- per month every three months are given together.
- * Girls who get married in needy Gujarati families will get financial assistance of Rs. 15,000/- from the society. Help is provided in the form of an offering.
- * Under the Ladli Laxmi scheme by the society, the parents of the Gujarati families in which a girl child is born, will be given F.D. of Rs. 6,000/- in the name of the girl child. D. is made and given.
- * Needy Gujarati women who are widowed or divorced are given Rs.500/- per month by the society in the form of financial assistance Rs.500/- per month is given together in every three months by the society as financial assistance to the differently-abled.
- * In needy Gujarati families, in whose place a member dies, then Rs 2,000 /- for his last rites. Financial assistance is provided by the society.
- * Food grains were distributed by the society to the needy Gujarati families during the Corona period. Apart from this the following services and facilities are also available
- Ambulance service by Smt. Naliniben Bhogilal Shah Gujarati Library Vachanalaya Smt. Rukmaniben Deepchand Gadi Parmarthik Charitable Trust and Jain Social Group.
- Smt. Kamalaben Raojibhai Patel Community Hall, Nasia Road, Indore, Shree Gujarati Samaj Seva Vehicle (Shav Vahan).

Along with all these activities Shri Gujarati Samaj aims at providing services to common people without any self-interest.

❧ **Document to be submitted with the Application Form :**

☞ **Rules for Admission :**

1. The decision of matter concerning admission as taken by admission committee will be final.
2. Provision for reservation of seats For SC, ST or OBC candidates is made as per rule of M.P. Govt.
3. Student found to have got admission by forging marks sheets, signature of parents etc. will be terminated from the college and full fee will be forfeited.
4. The candidate must produce original certificates of all the documents at the time of admission.
5. Fees once paid will not be refunded on cancellation of admission.
6. If applicant having criminal case pending in court of law shall not be given admission in college.
7. Caution money will be refunded after obtaining T.C. from the college and providing original receipt. It must be taken within one year after leaving college otherwise it will be forfeited.
